



- **Great Fish, Greater Revival**

Jonah 1-4

Lesson 82 Visuals

- **God commanded Jonah to leave Israel and go preach to the great city of Nineveh.**
- **Nineveh was in the east. Jonah ran away from God. He went west, the opposite direction of Nineveh.**
- **Jonah boarded a ship headed to Tarshish.**
- **Because of Jonah's disobedience, the LORD sent a great wind that caused a terrible storm.**
- **While the other sailors were calling out to their gods and doing everything they knew to save the ship, Jonah was sleeping below deck.**
- **Jonah told the sailors that they needed to throw him overboard into the sea.**



- **After they threw Jonah overboard, the raging sea calmed.**
- **Once Jonah was in the water, the LORD provided a great fish to swallow Jonah.**
- **Jonah was inside the great fish for three days and three nights.**
- **While inside the great fish, Jonah repented of his sin and rebellion and vowed to obey the LORD.**
- **Then the LORD commanded the fish to vomit Jonah onto dry land.**
- **If that fish had not swallowed him, Jonah would have drowned.”**
- **Just as before, God commanded Jonah to go to Nineveh. This time Jonah obeyed.**
- **Jonah warned that in forty days Nineveh will be destroyed.**
- **The people of Nineveh believed God’s message through Jonah.**



- **The king ordered everyone to stop eating and drinking and instead to urgently pray.**
- **The king of Nineveh commanded everyone to give up their evil ways and violence.**
- **The king of Nineveh said, “Who knows? God may change his mind.”**
- **When God saw that the Assyrians in Nineveh had turned from their evil ways, God decided not to destroy Nineveh.**
- **Jonah was angry when God changed his mind because he wanted God to destroy Nineveh.**
- **Jonah said, “I knew You are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love...”**
- **Then Jonah said, “Lord, take away my life for it is better for me to die than to live.**



- **God provided a vine that provided shade for Jonah.**
- **But the next day, God provided a worm that chewed the vine and caused it to wither.**
- **Then God provided an extremely hot east wind and the sun blazed on Jonah's head. Jonah then wanted to die.**
- **Jonah was concerned about that vine, but God was concerned about the 120,000 people who lived in Nineveh.**
- **2 Peter 3:9 says, "The Lord is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."**
- **1 Timothy 2:4 says, "God wants all people to be saved."**
- **Jonah 2:13 says, "Those who cling to worthless idols forfeit the grace that could be theirs."**
