



Elisha's Bones & Isaiah's Humility:

2 Kings 13, 2 Chronicles 25-26, Isaiah 6

Lesson 83 Visuals

- **Elisha became sick and died.**
- **God worked through Elisha to perform twice as many miracles as his predecessor Elijah.**
- **A dead man was thrown into Elisha's tomb. As soon as his dead body touched Elisha's bones, the dead man came back to life.**
- **King Amaziah gathered an army of 300,000 men from Judah and then hired 100,00 valiant warriors from Israel.**
- **King Amaziah paid 7,500 pounds of silver to hire warriors from Israel.**
- **Today that much silver is worth more than two million dollars.**



- Right after Amaziah gave away all that silver, the man of God told him, “Do not let Israel go to war with you.”
- The man of God warned Amaziah that Judah would be defeated if the Israelites warriors went with them to fight the Edomites.
- King Amaziah asked, “What should I do about the 7,500 pounds of silver?” The man of God replied, “The LORD is able to give you much more than this.”
- Amaziah follow God’s instructions and sent home the warriors from Israel.
- God gave Judah victory over the Edomites.
- It is never a waste to trust and obey God.
- Amaziah brought home Edomite idols after defeating the Edomites.
- Amaziah set those idols up as his gods and worshiped them.



- **God had just proved Himself as all-powerful by giving Amaziah victory. And the Edomite idols obviously had no power since the Edomites were defeated.**
- **Unrepented sin leads us to more and more sin and foolish decisions.**
- **The prophet told Amaziah that God intends to destroy him.**
- **Right after that, the northern kingdom of Israel invaded the southern kingdom of Judah.**
- **All the gold and silver in God's temple and all the treasures in the King's palace were taken.**
- **King Amaziah was killed by his own people.**
- **God gave King Uzziah success because he followed God's commands.**
- **But as King Uzziah became more and more powerful, he grew arrogant.**



- **Uzziah's pride and arrogance led to his destruction.**
- **Uzziah went into the temple and burned incense. According to God's instructions, only the priests were allowed to burn incense in the temple.**
- **Uzziah was a king, not a priest.**
- **Uzziah did not humble himself. Instead, he became angry when the priests told him to stop.**
- **Then the Lord struck Uzziah with the skin disease of leprosy.**
- **Uzziah had to live in quarantine away from others and was not allowed in the temple until his death.**
- **In the year that King Uzziah died, Isaiah had his vision of the Lord seated on His throne.**



- **Isaiah was overwhelmed by God’s holiness. Isaiah felt sinful in comparison to God’s holiness.**
- **When God asked, “Who should I send? Who will go for us?”, Isaiah said, “Here I am, Lord, Send me!”**
